**August 18<sup>th</sup>** marks the **100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary** of the ratification on the 19<sup>th</sup> Amendment to our US Constitution giving **WOMEN the RIGHT to VOTE!** Did you know that the suffrage movement last seven decades before the right was granted? The first women's rights convention took place in Seneca Falls, New York, on July 19-20, 1848.
